## **Oregon Shakespeare Festival Production History = 1930s**

The Festival began in 1935, with 2 productions directed by Angus Bowmer; *The Merchant of Venice* and *Twelfth Night*. In the beginning the actors, directors, and other staff were made up of townspeople and college students. In 1937, the Oregon Shakespearean Festival Association was incorporated as a non-profit. In 1939, the Festival was invited to participate in the Golden Gate Exposition, aka the San Francisco World's Fair. The company performed at the Federal Theatre on Treasure Island and also broadcast *The Taming of the Shrew* over NBC radio. Angus Bowmer would later cite this event as the one that provided the broader interest which allowed the Festival to reopen after WWII.
